A Bill to Implement a Universal Basic Income

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. **SECTION 1.** The United States federal government shall distribute \$1,000 a
- 3. month to each adult and \$500 a month to each child currently residing in the U.S.
- 4. **SECTION 2**. In order to be eligible, the child and adult must be legal residents, defined as
- 5. a person who by place of birth, nationality of one or both parents, or by going
- 6. through the naturalization process has sworn loyalty to a nation.
- 7. **SECTION 3.** The Department of Treasury will oversee implementation of this bill. All
- 8. necessary funding will be collected from a 5% increased income tax on
- 9. individuals whose income exceeds \$1 million per year.
- 10. **SECTION 4.** This bill will be implemented on January 1st, 2022.
- 11. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Add Justices to the Supreme Court

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. **SECTION 1.** The number of Associate Justices sitting on the Supreme Court will be
- 3. increased from 8 to 14.
- 4. **SECTION 2.** The vacancies will be added incrementally, 2 vacancies every two years.
- 5. **SECTION 3.** Normal procedures for Justice nomination will still be followed, including
- 6. Presidential nomination and Senate confirmation.
- 7. SECTION 4. This legislation will go into effect on February 1st, 2021, shortly following the
- 8. presidential inauguration, at which point the first two vacancies will be created.
- 9. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Provide Free Lunch for All K-12 Students

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 2 **SECTION 1.** The United States Federal Government shall fully subsidize the cost of
- 3 providing breakfast and lunch to students currently enrolled in public or
- 4 public-charter primary or secondary schools throughout the school year.
- 5 **SECTION 2.** This bill shall apply to schools that provide education to students in
- 6 Kindergarten through 12th grade.
- 7 **SECTION 3.** This bill shall be enforced by the Departments of Agriculture.
- 8 All necessary funding will be collected from a 5% increased income tax on
- 9 individuals whose income exceeds \$1 million per year.
- 10 **SECTION 4.** This bill shall be fully implemented by January 1st, 2022.
- 11 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill Related to Stock Ownership for Members of Congress

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 2. **SECTION 1.** The United States Federal Government shall hereby require that all members
- 3. of Congress, their staff, and their household must sell any stock before entering office and
- 4. that ownership of any stock while in office is prohibited.
- 5. **SECTION 2.** Members of Congress, their staff, and their household may not begin trading
- 6. stock until 12 months have elapsed since they left office.
- 7. **SECTION 3.** "Stock" is defined as ownership share of a company. The U.S. Securities and
- 8. Exchange Commission shall oversee the implementation of this bill.
- 9. **SECTION 4.** This bill will be implemented one month upon its passage.
- 10. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Resolution to Leave the United Nations

- 1. WHEREAS, the United Nations is plagued with corruption and mismanagement; and
- 2. WHEREAS, NATO is more effective at peacekeeping operations than UN troops; and
- 3. WHEREAS, the UN lacks any real means to enforce its resolutions; and
- 4. WHEREAS, the UN has five permanent Security Council members that can veto any
- 5. resolution that the majority of all UN members agreed upon; now, therefore, be it
- 6. **RESOLVED**, By the Congress here assembled that we disband our ties with the United
- 7. Nations; and be it
- 8. FURTHER RESOLVED, that we also recommend that the United Nations moves its
- 9. headquarters outside the United States.

- 1. WHEREAS, the region of Tibet has spent decades under Chinese rule; and
- 2. **WHEREAS**, the native people of this region have been subject to human rights

- 4. WHEREAS, the region has a unique cultural history that has been suppressed; and
- 5. **WHEREAS**, the diplomatic recognition of the region could open up needed foreign
- 6. investment and international human rights intervention; now, therefore,
- 7. **BE IT RESOLVED**, By the Congress here assembled that the United States of America
- 8. extend diplomatic relations to the leaders of Tibet and recognize it as an autonomous state.
