1	Whereas,	In August 2020, protests led by the June 5th movement led to a military
2		coup in Mali, and
3	Whereas,	The international community has condemned the military government and
4		urged for a peaceful transition back to a civilian-led, democratic
5		government; and
6	Whereas,	The United States has retracted military assistance to and cooperation with
7		Mali to further pressure the military government; and
8	Whereas,	US military assistance to Mali totaled \$145 million in 2017 and has been
9		critical to training troops for counterrorism operations; and
10	Whereas,	Islamic extremists have taken advantage of growing political instability in
11		Mali and are attempting to gain a stronghold in the region; now, therefore,
12		be it
13	Resolved,	By the Congress here assembled that the United States shall reinstate US
14		military assistance and cooperation with the Malian military to thwart
15		rising extremism; and, be it further
16	Resolved,	That the US shall work in conjunction with African Union Election
17		Observation Missions (AUEOM) to ensure fair, democratic elections are
18		held.

A Resolution to Use Ranked Choice Voting for National Elections

1	Whereas,	the current system of "first past the post" voting entrenches the
2		dominance of the two-party system in American politics by forcing people
3		with a wide variety of values, beliefs, and experiences to choose a
4		Democrat or Republican for fear of not wasting their vote; and
5	Whereas,	the founders of our country and most legal scholars today acknowledge
6		the harms of a two-party system; and
7	Whereas,	ranked-choice voting allows voters to rank candidates in their order of
8		preference; if a vote's top pick receives the fewest votes and no other
9		candidate earns over 50% of the vote, their vote transfers to their second
10		choice; and
11	Whereas,	in other countries where ranked-choice voting is used, there are a
12		significant number of parties representing the interests of specific groups
13		of people outside of the scope of the main parties; and
14	Whereas,	this system has been successfully used in congressional, state, and
15		municipal elections in America; now, therefore, be it
16	Resolved,	By the Congress here assembled that the American congressional and
17		presidential elections should use ranked choice voting rather than the
18		current "first past the post" method.

A Resolution to Eliminate Governmental Subsidies for the Fossil Fuel Industry

1	Whereas,	The United States is one of the largest contributors to climate change
2		globally due to massive subsidies for its fossil fuel sector; and
3	Whereas,	Subsidies result in lower prices for fossil fuels such as oil, coal, and gas -
4		this makes renewables appear vastly more expensive in the market; and
5	Whereas,	A transition to 100% renewable energy is crucial to mitigating the effects
6		of rising global temperatures; and
7	Whereas,	Studies have found that carbon emissions decline by 18% through the
8		elimination of subsidies; and
9	Whereas,	The European Union has implemented a policy of phasing-out fossil fuel
10		subsidies and has seen relative success in shifting to renewable energy;
11		and
12	Whereas,	Ending subsidization leaves an additional \$20 billion in public funds
13		available for investment into renewable energy; now, therefore, be it
14	Resolved,	By the Congress here assembled that the United States should eliminate
15		governmental subsidies for the fossil fuel sector to initiate a shift towards
