1	Be it enacted by this Palm Beach Catholic Forensic League Student Congress here

3	Article I:	\$150 billion will be allocated to build new public and affordable housing			
4		for homeless individuals. Public housing shall be provided for a minimum			
5		of one year, after which impacted families will be moved to affordable			
6		housing requiring rent payments, based on income limits set by the U.S.			
7		Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).			
8	Article II:	"Public housing" is housing provided for people with low incomes,			
9		subsidized by public funds. Affordable housing is defined by HUD as			
10		housing on which the occupant is paying no more than 30 percent of gross			
11		income for housing costs, including utilities. Homeless is defined as			
12		individuals who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence,			
13		and/or if they sleep in a shelter designated for temporary living			
14		accommodations or in places not designated for human habitation.			
15	Article III:	This legislation will go into effect January 1, 2023.			
16	Article IV:	HUD will oversee all aspects of this legislation, including allocating and			
17		distributing funds, and development of housing options in conjunction			
18		with the individual states.

8		third-party organization contracted by a government agency and aims to

10		B) Abolish shall be defined as the end of use and funding.			
11		C) Pecuniary funding shall be defined as any money that is presented			
12		through any method of funding from the federal government.			
13		D) Failure to be in compliance with this bill shall be defined as continued

16		continuation and forcing a closure, thus resulting in a fine of
