A Bill to Reduce the Cost of Epi-Pens and Pharmaceuticals

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Section 1. This bill aims to reduce the price of pharmaceuticals and epi-pens.

Section 2. Pharmaceuticals: a medicinal drug; Epi-Pens: used for a preparation of epinephrine administered by auto-injector

Section 3.

- A. The Food and Drug Administration would oversee the action of this bill by regulating the price of pharmaceuticals and imposing a fine on pharmacies that do not follow the new regulation.
- B. The funding will come from a new income tax of 1%.

Section 4. This legislation will take effect on January 19th, 2024.

Section 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Mandate the Disclosure of Taxes Corporations Pay

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2 **SECTION 1**. All corporations will be required to pay taxes based on 21% of their
- income, limiting the amount of avoidance tax schemes.
- 4 **SECTION 2**. Corporations will be defined as an organization authorized as a single
- 5 entity.
- 6 SECTION 3. The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) will oversee the implementation of
- 7 this bill

- 8 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall go into effect beginning April 15th, 2023
- 9 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

The Jane Roe Act

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Section 1: The Federal government will legalize abortion across all 50 states. Abortions will be allowed up to 12 weeks (3 months) of pregnancy.

Section 2: Abortions past the 3 month period may be allowed for women with health or life threatening issues, with a doctor's recommendation.

Section 3: The Department of Health and Human affairs will oversee the enforcement of this bill.

Section 4: This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2023. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Introduced for Congressional Debate by South Broward High School

A Bill to Ban Sugarcane Burning to Help the Environment

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1.

- A. The United States will ban the burning of sugarcane because of the harmful effects it produces.
- B. Sugarcane burning largely contributes to air pollution by releasing tremendous amounts of toxins such as nitrogen, carbon compounds, sulfates, and formaldehyde.

SECTION 2.

- A. Instead of using this method to dispose of waste, companies will be transitioned into utilizing green harvesting.
- B. Green harvesting is defined as using mechanical harvesters to mechanically separate the sugarcane leaves and tops from the sugar-bearing stalk where no burning is required.
- C. Materials left over from green harvesting can be used as mulch or to produce electricity, renewable energies, cattle feed, and more.

SECTION 3. The Environmental Protection Agency shall oversee the implementation of this legislation.

SECTION 4. This legislation will go into effect at the beginning of fiscal year 2023.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Introduced for Congressional Debate by Coral Springs Middle

The Newer Greener Deal

BE IT ENACTED BY CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- **Section 1.** An act to implement a 15% tax on all carbon emissions over status quo emissions over the next two years and limitations on industrial development in the US.
- **Section 2**. Enforcement by each Municipality/City is determined by individual definition of green space if such definition is deemed reasonable with existing EPA guidelines. Developers must earn approval before beginning construction.
- **Section 3.** The Environmental Protection Agency and Department of Treasury shall oversee the implementation of this bill and offer guidance and directives to State and Local agencies for enforcement purposes.
- **A.** Each property purchased by developers for the sake of new or redevelopment to dedicate 10 percent to green space to prevent and restore local deforestation and allow beautification and the environment to flourish.
- **B.** Developers who add additional green lots to their properties will be granted federal tax credits for each percentage above the mandated 10% of green space, not to exceed 35% to promote these actions.
- **C.** Companies that actively replace their carbon-emitting technology, within the two-year time frame, with renewable fuel technology shall receive 15% federal tax credit.
- **D.** Penalties for businesses not eliminating carbon emissions will consist of tax, initiating at 7.5 and growing to 15% over the course of the two years.
- **E.** Companies that emits dangerously high volumes of carbon emissions may apply for raised allotment on a case-by-case basis ranging from 0 to 25%, upon appeal to the EPA. Penalties for developers violating law shall be forfeiture of the property to the Department of Housing and Urban Development for the purpose of building affordable public housing.
- **Section 5.** This legislation will be implemented on January 1st of 2023 and run until December 31st of 2024.
- Section 6. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

FINAL ROUND A Bill to Decrease the National Debt

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	The United States' national debt is currently at \$30 trillion. If it continues t
2		rise, the United States risks a national financial crisis caused by inflation. To
3		prevent this catastrophe, Congress shall cut spending from certain
4		government programs and agencies to avoid deficit spending.
5	SECTION 2.	A. Inflation can be defined as the rate of increase in prices over a given
6		period of time.
7		B. Cut spending can be defined as lowering funding of government
8		programs to avoid excess spending.
9		C. Government programs and agencies can be defined as the military,
10		Department of Homeland Security, and Immigration and Customs
11		Enforcement.
12		D. Deficit spending shall be defined as when the expenses exceed the
13		revenue.
14	SECTION 3.	The implementation of this bill will be overseen by Congressional Budget
15		Office
16	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect at the start of the 2023 fiscal year.
17	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

FINAL ROUND

A Bill To Institute the Death Penalty In All 50 States

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

Section 1: The Federal government will institute capital punishment in all 50 states, for violent criminal offenders.

Section 2: Violent criminals will be defined as people convicted of first-degree murder.

Section 3: The Department of Justice will oversee the enforcement of this bill.

- A. The Department of Justice will make arrangements for those convicted of first-degree murder to be executed by lethal injection or electric chair.
- B. Hanging, gas chamber and firing squads will not be allowed as forms of executions under this bill.

Section 4: This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2023. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
