

A Bill to Incentivize Holocaust Education In Secondary Schools

1 **SECTION 1.** The United States shall incentivise school districts to implement Holocaust
2 education by providing grants of \$60,000 to school districts that mandate it
3 in middle and high schools. This grant will be pulled from a pool of \$1
4 billion, renewed each year, the source of which being provided in Section 3.

5 **SECTION 2.** Holocaust education will be defined as at least 20 hours of curriculum that
6 focuses on the events leading up to, the events of, and the aftermath of the
7 Holocaust, including, at minimum, the time period from the Weimar
8 Republic to the Nuremberg trials.

9 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Education will oversee implementation of this bill. This
10 legislation will be funded by a .075% income tax increase on those with a
11 household income of 500,000 dollars or more annually.

12 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect at the beginning of the fiscal year 2024.

13 SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Implement Land Value Tax

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2. **SECTION 1.** All land in the United States of America, unless federally
3. controlled, will be subject to a levied tax based on the
4. evaluated unimproved value of the land.
5. **SECTION 2.** The following definitions apply:
6. **A.** Unimproved value of land shall be defined as the estimated worth
7. of land without developments, and shall remain consistent
8. regardless of any improvements implemented.
9. **SECTION 3.** The Internal Revenue Service shall be responsible for the
10. enforcement of the tax and evaluating land.
11. **A.** The method of evaluation shall be left for the IRS to determine.
12. **SECTION 4.** Evaluation will begin immediately and the tax shall be levied
13. by January 1st 2025.
14. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
15. and void.

A Bill to implement National Drug Assistance and Recovery Programs

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2. **SECTION 1.** The Federal Government of the United States, to reaffirm its
3. commitment to public health, shall establish in each state
4. and their counties Centers for Addiction Treatment and
5. National Recovery programs within those Centers, whilst
6. dispensing 2 Million Dollars to aid the established centers.
7. **SECTION 2.** The following definitions apply:
8. **A.** County shall be defined as the geographical division of a state that
9. provides local government services to its people.
10. **B.** Treatment centers shall be defined as publically available medical
11. spaces that provide patients with specialized inpatient and
12. outpatient treatment, available within a patient's precinct.
13. **SECTION 3.** The U.S. Office of Management and Budget will coordinate in
14. conjunction with The Substance Abuse and Mental Health
- Services Administration to oversee the proper allocation of
- funding and medical resources to each established center.
- A.** If a state resists the implementation of treatment centers, it shall lose
- its allocated Medicaid funding even if it shall continue to expend
- funds on Medicaid programs.
- SECTION 4.** This bill shall take effect in the fiscal year of 2024.
- SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
- and void.

A Bill to Retrain our Police Force

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2. **SECTION 1.** Police officers will be compelled to fulfill compulsory
3. curriculums that will consist of information on police brutality
4. directed toward people of color and medical curricula on
5. how to constructively conduct oneself in situations with
6. unarmed manic civilians. This bill will also include new
7. ordinances within the police departments.
8. **SECTION 2.** Police officers will be required to take a 6 month curriculum
9. regarding racism as well as, police brutality along with a 1
10. year curriculum on how to proceed with mentally ill manic
11. civilians. The initial curricula will consist of several
12. exemplifications of police brutality, including several tests. The
13. second course will be instructed by medical professionals
14. who will educate them on ways to deal with manic patients
15. and how to tranquil them excluding the use of firearms.
16. **SECTION 3.** This will be overseen by the federal executive department
17. **A.** The new laws will include unnecessary police brutality and will be
18. charged with 25 to life in prison, turning off the body cam for any
19. reason will result in probation, and handling harmless civilians
20. **B.** Any current police officers will be required to take these courses
21. refusal to take these courses will result in immediate termination.
22. **SECTION 4.** This will be implemented 3 years after the bill after the bill has
23. passed.
24. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
25. and void.

A Bill to Encourage Drone Aircraft usage in the Military

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2. **SECTION 1.** The United States Military shall increase their use of military
3. grade drones for surveillance, strikes, and anything that they
4. deem necessary for use.
5. **SECTION 2.** The following definitions apply:
6. **A.** Drone Aircraft shall be defined as an aircraft without any human
7. pilot, crew, or passengers on board.
8. **SECTION 3.** The Defence intelligence Agency shall oversee the use of
9. drone strikes. The Airforce and Navy SEALs shall be using the
10. drone aircrafts. 1 Billion dollars shall be allocated for the first
11. year of funding and shall be reevaluated after 1 year.
12. **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2025
13. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
14. and void.

CHSAA 5A State Tournament Session 2 Bill 6

A Bill to Expand Vocational Training by Subsidizing Tuition

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Private trade schools that choose to offer free tuition will receive
3 subsidies from the United States Federal Government that are equal to
4 1.25 times the cost of tuition for all students.

5 **SECTION 2.** Trade schools are defined as postsecondary educational institutions
6 designed to train students for a specific job in a skilled trade career field.

7 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Education will be responsible for overseeing and
8 enforcing this legislation.

9 **SECTION 4.** Funding for this legislation will be taken from the US Department of
10 Defense's budget.

11 **SECTION 5.** This legislation will take effect at the beginning of the fiscal year 2025.

12 **SECTION 6.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
