- Grading/Judging:
 - We ask schools to provide ***one judge per speaking event***. All Academic coaches are ***expected*** to grade.
 - CX Debate Varsity & Novice
 - 1 Judge required per 4 entries
 - LD Debate Varsity & Novice
 - 1 Judge required per 4 entries
 - Congress:
 - Each school competing in Congress will need to provide a judge for Congress.
 - \$100 judges fee will be added to your invoice for all judges you are not able to provide.
 - Judging for writing events will take place in room ***3901***. Coaches able to help with these events are more than welcome (please!) - please let the registration table know if you are free.
- Placings/Divisions
 - We are ***not*** doing a large school and small school division.
 - We will be awarding ***top ten*** in majority of the events, varying on size of entries and time constraints
 - MVP Belts
 - There will be 5 championship belts awarded (Image link)

- Parking
 - Friday

Event Rules/FAQ's

- Computer Science
 - There are two options available for competing:
 - Option 1: Written and Programming on Friday only
 - Option 2: Written and Programming on Saturday only
 - only one team will count towards sweepstakes for each school and that team must be designated before the competition begins.
 - Computer Science Cap is at **10 teams**
- Computer Science PROGRAMMING:
 - Kindly ensure that your team is equipped with extension cords to facilitate power supply if needed.
 - It is **essential** that your team possesses a computer preloaded with a functional Integrated Development Environment (IDE) capable of compiling and executing code. (PC^2 will be made available on the day of the event.)
- Congress:
 - We are limiting the number of entries per school to 5 competitors.
 - Please have your legislation submitted no later than **October 10th,**
 - Once all legislation is submitted we will select and post them ASAP. You are not required to submit legislation, but are welcome to.
 - Docket order and PO nominations will be handled in the competition room.
 - As of right now we plan on using two rooms, but that is subject to change based on the number of entries.
- Math Events:
 - Math - Make sure you have your own calculator and batteries, none of these will be provided.
 - Number Sense - Although it is not required, we encourage kids to write in pen to avoid any temptations of erasing and being disqualified.
 - Calculator - Calculators are not provided.
- Computer Apps:
 - Contestants must provide their own laptop, printer, paper, extension cord and flash drive.
- Accounting:
 - Only four function calculators are permitted.
 - Calculators are not provided so please make sure your kids have their calculators and pencils upon arrival.
 - Students are encouraged to write their answers in uppercase lettering.
- Poetry/Prose
 - Interpers will be required to have both an A & B piece, there will be a draw held in the morning to determine which piece will be read during prelims.
 - There is **not** a documentation check, but we will be more than happy to check your documentation as practice.
 - finals will be based on Round 1 & 2 composite scores where a natural break happens and depending on # of contestants.

- Extemp
 - Informative / Persuasive will be flighted into a finals round depending on their prelim order. We will have the top 2 from each prelim room in a medal round, and the next 2 in each room in a consolation round.
- Debate
 - All debate contestants will have the chance to compete in extemp.
 - All debate coaches ***will need to be available*** as judges for any prelim round.
- Soapbox:
 - Get up on your soapbox and go off. 5 minute maximum and no notes allowed. There will not be any grace period. Language and topics should be school appropriate. Judges' decisions are final.

- Storytelling:
 - Students will need to prepare their pieces in advance and bring the original book for them to read from. 7 minute maximum, no grace period. The title and author must be presented in your performance. You must use the story book in your performance. The idea here is that you are reading to a classroom of students. Actual students or elementary teachers will be used in final rounds as judges.

- Impromptu Speaking:
 - Each contestant will draw 5 topics and choose 1 each round. Contestants will have 8 minutes to use as they choose for preparation and speaking, but must conclude their speech before their 8 minutes are up.

 - We are allowing commercials, so disregard Rule #2 on the second page.
- Journalism/Ready Writing
 - We will be providing computers and access to a printer for all writing events.
 - We are capping at 60 contestants for each event
 - We have a few judges brought in, but request each team provide a coach to expedite the long process.
 - For students competing in back to back writing events, please remind them they can always take a restroom break in the middle. They just need to say something.
 - AP Stylebooks and dictionaries will not be provided (but are allowed)
 - Copy editing test will be made using the 2022-2024 version of the AP stylebook.
 - Third page/round three of copy editing has to be filled out or the contestant will be disqualified.
- Spelling
 - The test will be on paper, but there will be an audio file that will pronounce the words.
