TIPS FOR WRITING LEGISLATION



Want feedback on a student's proposal? Submit it early with a request for feedback.







BILL

Attempts to solve a problem, specifically outlining HOW.



RESOLUTION

Addresses a position statement on something Congress does NOT have jurisdiction over



AMENDMENT

Proposes a change to the Constitution, setting a standard or creating a procedure



KEEP

TWEAK



- Try to keep your legislation under a page - less is more.
- Include topics that are applicable to Congressional power
- Address topics that have several potential arguments on each side
- Save the "why" for your speech, especially for a bill
- Make sure your Bill is Constitutional and within Congressional power
- Avoid including funding in a Resolution or Amendment

CONGRESS CANNOT INTERFERE WITH POWERS RESERVED TO THE STATES

If you are interested in writing a bill that would impact education, try something like "A Resolution to Condemn ... in Public Schools" instead of "A Bill to... [School District or state official]." Why? Because Congress cannot make a law about a specific state or local government's education, fire, or police department.
