

April 2024 FFL Novice/Middle Semis Legislation

A Bill to Send Infrastructure Aid to the African Union (AU)

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Section 1. A. \$1 billion shall be sent to the African Union to fund infrastructure
3 projects.

4 B. Half of the infrastructure workers shall be American. Half shall be
5 African.

6 Section 2. Infrastructure projects shall be defined as any short-term or long-term
7 projects that support basic physical and organizational structures and
8 facilities needed for the operation of society, including but not limited to
9 buildings, roads, and power supplies.

10 Section 3. A. The United States Agency for International Development (USAID)
11 shall oversee the implementation of this legislation.

12 B. 20% of US funding currently allocated to the Egyptian Armed
13 Forces, shall be reallocated to fund this bill. The remainder of the
14 funding necessary shall be taken from the Department of Defense
15 budget.

16 Section 4. This legislation will take effect January 1, 2025.

17 Section 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

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A Resolution Declaring a Two-China Foreign Policy

- 1 Whereas, The United States does not have a policy regarding Taiwan that is
2 consistent with its other international policies; and
- 3 Whereas, As a major global power, the United States ought to support democracy
4 where it exists in the world; and
- 5 Whereas, The Republic of China is a democratically-governed nation, yet is not
6 recognized as a sovereign state by the government of the United States;
7 therefore, be it
- 8 Resolved, by this Student Congress here assembled that: The United States adopt a
9 two-China foreign policy recognizing the Republic of China as a separate
10 state from the People’s Republic of China.

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A Bill to Establish Employment Opportunities for U.S. War Veterans

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 Section 1: This bill will establish employment opportunities for able-bodied United
3 States war veterans. This would create jobs for retired war veterans after
4 they return from over sea conflicts and assignments.

5 Section 2: This would allow for some 1 million unemployed war veterans back in
6 the economy and back to work. Types of jobs include Firemen and Police
7 officers. These new jobs will promote a veteran's self-worth by allowing
8 for a return to a productive use of their time and by decreasing the
9 percentage of post-war psychological issues.

10 Section 3: The Department of Labor and the U.S. Departments of Veteran Affairs
11 will execute and carry out all party of this bill upon passage.

12 Section 4: This legislation will take effect January 1, 2025.

13 Section 5: All other laws that come into conflict with this new policy shall hereby be
14 declared null and void.
