#### A Bill to Establish Rent Control Standards Nationwide to Ensure Housing Affordability

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 SECTION 1.	Nationwide rent control standards shall be established to cap annual rent		
3	increases for residential properties at 3%, or the rate of inflation as		
4	determined by the Consumer Price Index (CPI), whichever is lower.		
5 SECTION 2.	Rent control is defined as government regulations limiting the amount a		
6	landlord can charge for leasing a home (including, but not limited to		
7	houses, apartments, lofts, studios, condos) or renewing a lease.		
8 SECTION 3.	The Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) will enforce		
9	this legislation. HUD will collaborate with state and local housing		
10	agencies to monitor compliance, manage disputes, and provide resources		
11	for enforcement.		
12	A. A federal grant program will be established to support state and local		
13	housing agencies with enforcement costs, funded at \$500 million		
14	annually.		
15	B. Rent control standards shall apply to all rental properties, except		
16	those participating in the Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program,		
17	which will continue to follow existing HUD guidelines.		
18 SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2025. All laws in conflict with		
19	this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# E-Bike Safety Act (ESA)

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1. The use of E-bikes may hereby be regulated for the safety	
2	and general well being of the public.	
3	SECTION 2. Electric bikes are defined as bicycles equipped with a battery	
4	and a small electric motor to assist you in pedaling faster and farther.	
5	E-bikes are offered in a variety of styles, including cargo bikes, commuting	
6	bikes, mountain bikes, folding bikes, etc.	
7	<b>SECTION 3.</b> The Department of Transportation in collaboration with the	
8	Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) will oversee the	
9	implementation of this bill.	
10	A. Enforcing E-bikes to be recognized as their own category separated from	
11	non-motorized bikes and motorcycles.	
12	B. Reforming safety regulations and access of E-bikes.	
13	C. A change of age requirement for operation of E-bikes shall now be	
14	issued to those who wish to use the form of transportation (which will	
15	be 16+).	
16	D. Mandating use of a stronger helmet, enforcement of obeying traffic laws	
17	like maintaining under 20 MPH, and using bike lanes, streets, highways,	
18	and roadways without use of sidewalks.	
19	E. Changing the manufacturing of lithium (E-bike) batteries from voluntary	
20	to mandatory standards.	
21	<b>SECTION 4.</b> This legislation will take effect on FY 2027. All laws in	
22	conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

### A Bill to Nationally Legalize Sports Betting

6		B: The federal government will impose a tax on sports betting of 15% on	
5		sportsbooks on top of the original state tax. Tax funding will be discretionary	
6		funding for Congress to allocate.	
7		C: Tax revenue will be allocated to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services	
8		Administration (SAMHSA) for sports betting education and addiction resources.	
9	ARTICLE III	The Department of Commerce will oversee the implementation of this	
10		legislation.	
11	ARTICLE IV	The implementation date of this bill will be September 1, 2025.	
12	ARTICLE V	All laws and regulations in conflict with this legislation will be hereby null and	
13		void.

# A Bill to Prevent Employers from Using Employees' Social Media Presence Against Them

3		to give employers their personal social media to monitor their accounts.
4	SECTION 2.	Social Media will be defined as any and all publicly made posts made on
5		personal time and accounts.
6		Employees include all working and potential applicants in all regions of
7		work.
8	SECTION 3.	The U.S. Department of Labor shall oversee the enforcement and
9		implementation of this bill.
10		A. If caught in violation of this legislation, employers will be subject to a
11		fine of \$10,000, which will double for each subsequent violation.
12	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect immediately after passage. All laws in
13		conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

#### A Bill to Regulate the Use of Autonomous Vehicles in Commercial Transportation

1	SECTION 1.	Autonomous vehicles shall be prohibited from being utilized	
2	in commercial transportation services.		
3	SECTION 2.	Autonomous vehicles are defined as vehicles equipped with	
4	software and technology that enable them to operate without active		
5	human control.		
6	,	Commercial transportation services refer to services where	
7	vehicles are hired or rented for temporary use by individuals or groups,		
8	including rideshares and taxis.		
9	SECTION 3.	The U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) shall be	
10	responsible for enforcing the provisions of this legislation and developing		
11	safety regulations to address potential software malfunctions in		
12	autonomous vehicles used in any other contexts.		
13	SECTION 4.	This legislation will be effective immediately after passage.	
14	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared	
	null and void.
