A Bill to Provide Paid Parental Leave

1	BE IT ENACT	TED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1.	The United States Federal Government shall mandate businesses with twenty or
3		more employees to provide paid parental leave to all employees experiencing a
4		qualifying life event.
5	SECTION 2.	For this legislation:
6		A. Paid parental leave shall be defined as a period of fully paid time off from work
7		afforded to all parents, regardless of gender.
8		B. A qualifying life event shall be defined as the birth or adoption of a child or
9		children.
10	SECTION 3.	The Department of Labor's Wage and Hour Division shall enforce this legislation:
11		A. An employer shall not reduce wages within six months prior to a known
12		qualifying life event.
13		B. Paid parental leave shall be provided for a period of at least ninety days.
14		C. Companies found to be out of compliance shall have their business license
15		revoked.
16	SECTION 3.	This legislation will take effect on September 1st, 2026. All laws in conflict with
17		legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to End Federal Subsidization of Healthcare for Congresspeople

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1 . Elected members of federal Congress (Representatives and Senators) shall no longer
3	receive any employer contributions from the federal government toward their
4	healthcare costs, including dental and vision insurance. Should a Representative or
5	Senator choose to purchase health, dental, or vision coverage, they shall be
6	responsible for covering these costs on their own.
7	SECTION 2 . Should universal healthcare someday be provided to citizens of the United States and
8	its territories, Representatives and Senators shall of course reap these benefits along
9	with their constituents, unless specifically excluded from them
10	SECTION 3. The money saved through this legislation shall be redirected to the Centers for
11	Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to support insurance for those in need.
12	SECTION 4. This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2026. All laws in conflict with this
13	legislation are hereby declared null and void.

All Oasis Act

1	BE IT ENAC'	TED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1.	A. The United States shall decrease energy costs through investing in wind power
3		structures. The U.S will reallocate half of all federal fossil fuel subsidies for the
4		implementation of wind power on public land and water.
5		B. 75% of subsidies shall be administered with the purpose of constructing new
6		wind power structures on public land and water.
7		C. 25% of subsidies shall be directed towards private businesses with the purpose
8		of researching, innovating, and developing wind power.
9		D. Energy enterprises shall decrease energy costs by 20% below current industry
10		prices.
11	SECTION 2.	"Public Land and Water" shall be defined as land or sea territory owned by the
12		federal government, excluding national parks and ecologically protected areas.
13		"Wind Power" shall be defined as renewable energy structures that harness the
14		power of wind to generate electricity. "Energy Enterprises" shall be defined as
15		companies boasting over 5 billion in annual revenue.
16	SECTION 3.	The Environmental Protection Agency in conjunction with the Department of
17		Energy will oversee the implementation of this legislation.
18		A. The EPA shall oversee the administration of federal subsidies and will conduct
19		semi-annual reports submitted to the DOE on the effect of this legislation on the
20		environment as well as financial developments and their effects.
21		B. The DOE will carry out necessary accommodations based on the EPA's report.
22	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on FY 2026. All laws in conflict with this legislation
23		are hereby declared null and void.

The Cuban Ascension Policy Act (C.A.P. Act)

1	BE IT ENAC'	TED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1.	The United States government shall lift economic sanctions on the country of
3		Cuba by repealing the Helms-Burton Act, Cuban Assets Control Regulations, and
4		the Cuban Democracy Act. Furthermore, the United States Government shall
5		engage in foreign relations with the country of Cuba to achieve and maintain the
6		goal of open trade and borders between one another.
7	SECTION 2.	The definitions for this act are as follows:
8		A. The Cuban Assets Control Regulations shall be abbreviated if necessary to
9		"The CACR."
10		B. The Office of the United States Trade Representative shall be abbreviated if
11		necessary to "The USTR."
12	SECTION 3.	The United States Congress shall oversee the repealing of the Helms-Burton Act,
13		Cuban Assets Control Regulations, and the Cuban Democracy Act. The USTR shall
14		be tasked with foreign relations with Cuba to achieve the goals stated in Section 1.
15	SECTION 4.	This act shall go into effect 90 days after passage. All laws in conflict
16		with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
