

## **A Resolution to Establish a Military Base in Egypt**

1 **WHEREAS,** Egypt is facing instability within and along their borders while dealing with  
2 increased threats of violence from terrorist groups; and

3 **WHEREAS,** hundreds of people are being killed every year due to an increase of attacks, and  
4 the government is unable to completely stop or prevent them; and

5 **WHEREAS,** Egypt is an invaluable ally to the United States and it is in a prime strategic  
6 location in the center of the North Africa and on the border of the Middle East;  
7 now, therefore be it

8 **RESOLVED,** That by the United States Congress here assembled shall encourage the  
9 construction of a joint military base in Egypt between the United States Army  
10 and the Egyptian government to provide stability to the region and nearby  
11 countries, and combat terrorism; and, be it

12 **FURTHER RESOLVED,** That the United States shall provide the necessary funding to create  
13 and maintain the base with the Egyptian government.

## **The AI Manhattan Project Act (AIMPA)**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Congress shall apportion \$30 billion to the Department of Defense and the

3 Department of Energy for the immediate initiation of the AI Manhattan Project.

4 **SECTION 2.** The term AI Manhattan Project shall refer to the government consolidation of all

5 relevant private and public sector resources to develop Artificial General Intelligence

6 capabilities as soon as possible. As a matter of national defense, such a project

7 would receive top priority and be executed with the strictest confidentiality to protect

8 against foreign espionage.

9 **SECTION 3.** The Congressional Budget Office shall be tasked with bringing about the economic

10 feasibility of such an expensive undertaking. All funding options shall be open for

11 consideration, including significant reallocation of the current budgets of the

12 Department of Defense and the Department of Energy.

13 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall be jointly overseen by the Department of Defense and the

14 Department of Energy.

15 **SECTION 5.** This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.

16 **SECTION 6.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## **A Bill to Establish Rent Control Standards Nationwide**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Nationwide rent control standards shall be established to cap annual rent

3 increases for residential properties at 3%, or the rate of inflation as determined

4 by the Consumer Price Index (CPI), whichever is lower.

5 **SECTION 2.** Rent control is defined as government regulations limiting the amount a landlord

6 can charge for leasing a home (including, but not limited to houses, apartments,

7 lofts, studios, condos) or renewing a lease.

8 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) will enforce this

9 legislation. HUD will collaborate with state and local housing agencies to monitor

10 compliance, manage disputes, and provide resources for enforcement.

11 A. A federal grant program will be established to support state and local

12 housing agencies with enforcement costs, funded at \$500 million annually.

13 B. Rent control standards shall apply to all rental properties, except those

14 participating in the Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program, which will

15 continue to follow existing HUD guidelines.

16 **SECTION 4.** This bill will go into effect October 1, 2026.

17 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## **A Bill to Ensure Competency in the Department of Education**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** No individual shall serve in any decision-making role within the Department of  
3 Education without having attained a bare minimum of experience as an educator  
4 within the United States and its territories.

5 **SECTION 2.** A decision-making role shall be defined as any role that empowers the individual  
6 holding it to affect education policy in any way whatsoever, however minute. A bare  
7 minimum of experience as an educator shall be defined as at least thirty (30)  
8 cumulative days within a six-month period spent as a classroom teacher, including  
9 substitute teaching, with no statute of limitations on this requirement.

10 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall not apply to any persons currently working for the Department  
11 of Education but only to all future appointees and hires.

12 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall be overseen by the Department of Education.

13 **SECTION 5.** This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.

14 **SECTION 6.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
