Bill A: A Bill to Increase Funding for the National Park Service to Promote Environmental Preservation and Public Enjoyment Round 1, Item 1

1	SECTION 1.	The National Park Service (NPS) shall receive a 67% increase in annual
2		federal funding to improve environmental conservation efforts,
3		infrastructure maintenance, staff support, and public access across all U.S.
4		national parks and federally protected lands.
5	SECTION 2. T	ne Department of the Interior shall reallocate an additional \$4 billion
6		annually from funds formerly allocated to administrative public health
7		initiatives deemed redundant or non-essential in the current fiscal
8		assessment.
9	SECTION 3. T	he Office of Management and Budget (OMB), in coordination with the
10		Department of the Treasury, shall oversee the reallocation and ensure
11		transparent distribution of funds to the NPS.
12	SECTION 4. Fo	unds must be used for the following purposes:
13	А	. Restoration of trails, wildlife habitats, and park infrastructure.
14	В	Expansion of renewable energy and sustainability initiatives within the park
15		system.
16	C.	Hiring and training of additional park rangers and conservation staff.
17	D	. Development of new educational programs and visitor services.
18	SECTION 5. T	his legislation shall take effect on October 1st, 2026. All laws or budgetary
19		provisions in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Bill B: Bill to Establish a National Political Assasination Day to Honor Victims and Raise Awareness:

Round 1, Item 2

1	SECTION 1.	The United States shall officially recognize June 7th each year as National
2		Gun Violence Remembrance Day. This day shall be used to honor victims
3		and survivors of gun violence and to promote efforts to prevent future
4		tragedies.
5	SECTION 2.	On this day, citizens are encouraged to wear the color orange in solidarity,
6		participate in gun violence educational programs, and engage in
7		community-based anti-violence activities.
8	SECTION 3.	The Department of Education and the Department of Health and Human
9		Services shall collaborate to provide grants to schools, nonprofits, and local
10		governments to organize events and educational campaigns.
11	SECTION 4.	This legislation shall mandate closures of schools and businesses, and
12		impose penalties on those who choose not to participate.
13	SECTION 5.	This act will take effect on January 1st, 2026. All laws in conflict with this
14		legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Bill C: A Bill to Improve Mental Health Support for Air Traffic Controllers to Ensure Aviation Safety and Worker Wellbeing Round 1, Item 3

1	SECTION 1. The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) shall receive a 50% increase in
2	annual federal funding specifically designated for expanding mental health
3	resources and services for air traffic controllers at all U.S. commercial and
4	military airports.
5	SECTION 2. The Department of Transportation (DOT) shall reallocate \$2.5 billion annually
6	from discretionary aviation infrastructure spending deemed non-essential
7	in the current fiscal year to support the implementation of this act.
8	SECTION 3. The FAA, in collaboration with the Department of Health and Human Services
9	(HHS), shall oversee the creation, distribution, and management of all
10	mental health programs for air traffic control personnel.
11	SECTION 4. Funds must be used for the following purposes:
12	A. Establishment of on-site mental health clinics and confidential
13	counseling services at major airports.
14	B. Implementation of regular mental health screenings and wellness
15	check-ins for all air traffic controllers.
16	C. Development of peer support networks and stress management training
17	programs.
18	D. Hiring and retention of licensed mental health professionals with
19	expertise in occupational stress and trauma.
20	SECTION 5. This legislation shall take effect on January 1st, 2027. All laws or budgetary
21	provisions in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void

Bill D Maternal And Paternal Improvement Act (M.A.P.I.) Round 1, Item 4

1	SECTION 1.	This bill establishes a right to paid maternal and paternal leave. Any
2		business not considered a small business in their industry must provide at
3		least 16 weeks of paid maternal leave to a person who has given birth in
4		the immediate period following the birth, and at least 12 weeks of paid
5		paternal leave to a person whos partner has given birth or has adopted a
6		child.
7	SECTION 2.	For the purpose of this bill
8		A. Paid maternal and paternal leave are designated as 80% of the full salary
9		of the person taking the leave
10		B. The person or persons taking the leave must have been employed for at
11		a minimum the 10 months leading up to the birth or adoption.
12	SECTION 3.	The US Department of Labor will be in charge of the implementation of this
13		bill.
14		A. The Department of Labor will create an Office of Parental Leave,
15		authorized to enforce this bill and issue fines.
16		B. The fine for violating this bill will be \$1000 per day, per violation for the
17		first three months after the implementation of this legislation. Then the
18		fine shifts to \$1000000 per day, per violation

Bill E A Bill to Make Available Federal Funds the Mass Removal of the Burmese Python From the Florida Everglades. Round 2, Item 1

1	SECTION 1.	This bill would see the United States government send the state of Florida
2		\$5 million to remove Burmese Pythons from Everglades National Park.
3	SECTION 2.	Burmese Python is defined as a very large python native to southeastern
4		Asia that has a tannish skin marked with olive brown blotches and is often
5		kept as a pet.
6	SECTION 3.	The Department of the Treasury will oversee enforcement of this bill.
7	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on January 1st 2027. All laws in conflict with
8		this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Bill F A Bill to Give Felons the Right to Vote Whilst Incarcerated Round 2, Item 2

1	SECTION 1.	This bill would give Felons nationwide the ability to register and vote whilst
2		incarcerated in both state and federal prisons. \$500,000 will be set aside to
3		cover any needed expenses.
4	SECTION 2.	Felon is defined as a person who has been convicted of a felony.
5		Incarcerated is defined as to be confined or imprisoned in a correctional
6		facility.
7	SECTION 3.	The Department of Justice will oversee enforcement of this bill.
8		
9	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on April 1st 2026. All laws in conflict with
10		this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Bill G A Bill to Regulate Artificial Intelligence Development Round 2, Item 3

1	SECTION 1.	To establish stronger federal oversight and ethical standards for the
2		development, deployment, and use of artificial intelligence (AI)
3		technologies in order to protect public safety, national security, and
4		individual rights.
5	SECTION 2.	Artificial Intelligence (AI) is defined as any system that can perform tasks
6		that normally require human intelligence, including but not limited to
7		natural language processing, image recognition, predictive analytics, and
8		autonomous decision-making.
9		High-risk AI is defined as systems that could significantly impact privacy,
10		employment, civil rights, or safety (e.g., facial recognition, autonomous
11		weapons, algorithmic hiring, or AI in law enforcement).
12	SECTION 3.	A. The Department of Commerce, in coordination with the National
13		Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST), shall create an AI Regulatory
14		Oversight Board (AIROB).
15		B. All organizations developing or deploying high-risk AI must register their
16		projects with AIROB prior to public release. And submit annual
17		transparency reports detailing training data, sources, bias mitigation
18		efforts, and risk assessments.
19		C Al systems used in hiring education healthcare criminal justice or
20		C. Al systems used in hiring, education, healthcare, criminal justice, or
21		national defense shall undergo mandatory bias and security audits before
22		implementation. D. Al-generated content must be clearly labeled as synthetic or
23		
24		machine-produced when distributed to the public.
25	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on January 1st 2027. All laws in conflict with
26		this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

1	SECTION 1.	All public transportation stops must have an electric scooter or electric
2		bicycle available within one mile of the stop.
3	SECTION 2.	An electric bike is a bike that has been electrified.
4		An electric scooter is a scooter that has been electrified
5		A public transit stop is defined as a bus, light rail, train or ferry.
6	SECTION 3.	The Department of Transportation will be in charge of implementing this bil
7		any state found in violation of this will receive a \$10000 fine as well as be
8		mandated to invest \$50000 in public transit expansion.
9	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on January 1st 2030. All laws in conflict with
10		this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
11
