Round 1, Item 1

A Bill to Allow Voting by Phone in State and Federal Elections

- 1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**
- 2 **SECTION 1.** Mobile voting (voting by phone) shall hereby be permitted and
3 available in state and federal elections for all registered voters.
- 4 **SECTION 2.** The voting technology will be required to provide audits of vote
5 casting, so that the voters can also check themselves if their vote is
6 tabulated correctly.
- 7 **SECTION 3.** This option will be available for every registered voter, especially
8 voters who face barriers to traditional voting options, including voters with
9 disabilities, military and overseas voters, voters on tribal lands, hospitalized
10 voters, and voters experiencing natural disasters or other emergencies.
- 11 **SECTION 4.** The Federal Elections Commission will oversee the enforcement of
12 this legislation.
- 13 **SECTION 5.** This legislation will take effect on January 1st, 2026.
- 14 **SECTION 6.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and
15 void.

A Bill to Create a Four-Day School Week

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**

2 **Section 1.** The United States federal government shall make all public school
3 weeks Monday through Thursday. Each individual state will decide how to
4 designate the rest of the required time based on their own education
5 requirements. Any schools or school districts already practicing a four-day school
6 week will be exempt from this bill.

7 **Section 2.** Public school shall be defined as an institution for educating children
8 that is funded by the federal government.

9 **Section 3.** The U.S. Department of Education shall oversee the implementation
10 of this bill. Any schools who are found in violation of this legislation will lose
11 federal funding indefinitely.

12 **Section 4.** This legislation will take effect at the beginning of the 2026-2027
13 school year.

14 **Section 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and
15 void.

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Round 1, Item 3

The National High Speed Rail Act

- 1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**
- 2 **Section 1.** The United States shall construct and maintain a high-speed rail
- 3 system connected through major metropolitan areas in the United States. The
- 4 project will be developed in collaboration with Amtrak.
- 5 **Section 2.** High-Speed Rail System shall be defined as a network of tracks for
- 6 passenger trains that travel at least 155 miles per hour (or 250 kilometers/hour).
- 7 **Section 3.** The Department of Transportation (DOT) will plan and propose the
- 8 project with estimated costs of production. Funding for the railway will be
- 9 reallocated over eight years from the Department of Defense.
- 10 **Section 4.** This legislation will go into effect 90 days after passage.
- 11 **Section 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and
- 12 void.

Round 2, Item 1

A Bill to Incorporate AI into Military Operations

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**

2 **Section 1.** The United States shall allocate \$25 billion to incorporate fully
3 autonomous artificial intelligence into military operations.

4 **Section 2.** Artificial intelligence (AI) is a machine-based computer system that
5 can replicate human functions and improve performance through learning. Fully
6 autonomous AI refers to AI systems that can operate without human intervention.

7 **Section 3.** The U.S. Department of Defense shall oversee this legislation, with
8 funding directed toward AI development for data analysis, reconnaissance, and
9 cybersecurity defense.

10 **Section 4.** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2026.

11 **Section 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and
12 void.

A Bill to Introduce a National ID Card

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**

2 **Section 1.** The United States shall implement a system of nationally issued
3 identification cards to replace all other state-issued identification cards, including
4 but not limited to drivers' licenses and learners' permits.

5 **Section 2.** For the purposes of this act identification cards shall be defined as
6 physical government- issued documents for the purpose of proving the identities
7 of citizens.

8 **Section 3.** This legislation shall be overseen and enforced by the Department of
9 Homeland Security. Funding for enforcement of this legislation shall be originated
10 in increased taxes for states, territories, and federal districts equivalent to their
11 former budgets to produce identification cards or documents.

12 **Section 4.** This legislation will take effect on January 1st, 2027.

13 **Section 5.** All existing laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared
14 null and void.

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Round 2, Item 3

A Bill to Fund Private Space Exploration Startups

- 1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**
- 2 **Section 1.** Congress shall allocate financial resources from the space
- 3 exploration budget to fund private space exploration startups to increase
- 4 scientific research and innovation.
- 5 **Section 2.** “Private Space Exploration Startups” will be defined as
- 6 non-governmental or privately- owned entities focused on developing and/or
- 7 offering equipment and services geared towards spaceflight.
- 8 **Section 3.** The House Committee of Science, Space, and Technology will
- 9 oversee the implementation of this bill. The initial budget will be \$5 billion, taken
- 10 from funds previously given to NASA. All allocated funds shall be dispersed
- 11 within one year.
- 12 **Section 4.** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2026.
- 13 **Section 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and
- 14 void.

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
