

**A Bill to Ban the Sale of Flavored Nicotine and Tobacco  
Products to  
Reduce Usage and Addiction in Teens**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** Under the passage of this legislation, the selling and production of flavored  
2 nicotine and tobacco products will mandatorily cease.

3 **SECTION 2.** Nicotine and tobacco products are those containing the addictive chemical  
4 substance 3-(1-Methyl-2-pyrrolidinyl) pyridine (nicotine) or tobacco in any  
5 form, whether it be a salt, leaf, or complex. These products can have a  
6 characterizing flavor other than tobacco or menthol defining them as  
7 flavored nicotine and tobacco products. The ban will not include nicotine  
8 replacement therapy forms such as gum or patches as these have a  
9 definitive medical purpose.

10 **SECTION 3.** The U.S Food and Drug Administration will oversee enforcement through  
11 denying all premarket tobacco product applications for flavored nicotine  
12 and tobacco products and issuing a formal rule.

13 A. Denying premarket tobacco product applications for manufacturers will  
14 completely restrict the movement and distribution of any flavored  
15 nicotine and tobacco onto the market.

16 B. This is national law and all states must follow

17 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on February 7, 2027. All laws in conflict with  
18 this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# A Bill to Reform the Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) to Promote Transparency and Accountability

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** The Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agency shall adopt  
2 reforms to ensure accountability, transparency, and the safe enforcement  
3 of immigration law.
- 4 **SECTION 2.** A. ICE officers engaged in civilian enforcement operations shall be required  
5 to use non-lethal weapons as their primary means of enforcement, except  
6 in situations where the use of lethal force is necessary to prevent imminent  
7 loss of life.  
8 B. ICE shall be prohibited from conducting enforcement operations within  
9 the interior of the United States without a memorandum of understanding  
10 (MOU) signed with the relevant state or local government law enforcement  
11 agency.  
12 C. ICE officers are prohibited from wearing face coverings, masks, or other  
13 identity-concealing agents during operations not involving undercover or  
14 human trafficking investigations, ensuring that officers remain identifiable  
15 to the public.
- 16 **SECTION 3.** There are three key provisions:  
17 A. The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) shall oversee enforcement  
18 of these provisions.  
19 B. ICE agents found in violation shall be subject to internal disciplinary  
20 review by the DHS Office of Professional Responsibility.  
21 C. DHS shall provide annual public reports detailing compliance with  
22 use-of-force policies, MOU agreements, and transparency requirements.
- 23 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on passage. All laws in conflict with this  
24 legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Bill to Require Personal Finance as a Graduation Requirement

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** In response to widespread financial illiteracy among Americans, a  
2 standardized personal finance course shall be required for high school  
3 graduation, beginning with the class of 2030.
- 4 **SECTION 2.** A. "Personal Finance Course" is defined as a class that provides students  
5 with foundational knowledge and practical skills in personal finance. The  
6 course shall cover, at minimum, topics such as budgeting, saving,  
7 borrowing, investing, career planning, retirement planning, estate  
8 planning, insurance, and income taxes, as well as the use of personal  
9 finance tools relevant after graduation.
- 10 B. "Standardized" means access to a nationally developed online training  
11 and curriculum framework, consistent with guidance issued from the  
12 Financial Literacy and Education Commission of the U.S. Department of the  
13 Treasury. Districts may adopt the framework or develop their own courses,  
14 provided they, at minimum, align with the requirements outlined in part A.
- 15 **SECTION 3.** This bill shall be administered and overseen by the Financial Literacy and  
16 Education Commission, with support from the U.S. Department of the  
17 Treasury. Funding shall be provided as follows:
- 18 A. \$1 billion shall be allocated in the first year of implementation for  
19 national course development and teacher training.
- 20 B. \$150 million shall be allocated annually thereafter for program  
21 maintenance, curriculum updates, and ongoing educator training.
- 22 C. Program expenditures shall be reviewed and evaluated every five years,  
23 with adjustments made as necessary to ensure continued effectiveness  
24 and fiscal responsibility.
- 25 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on October 1, 2026.
- 26 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Bill to Require Watermarking AI-Generated Content to Protect Intellectual Ability

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** All AI-generated content shall hereby be required to be watermarked.
- 2 **SECTION 2.** Watermarking for generative artificial intelligence detection and generative  
3 artificial intelligence shall be for the purposes of protecting intellectual  
4 ability.
- 5 **SECTION 3.** For the purpose of this bill, the following terms shall be defined:
- 6 A. The term generative artificial intelligence detection means, with  
7 respect to digital content, the positive identification of the use of  
8 generative artificial intelligence in the generation of such content.
- 9 B. The term generative artificial intelligence watermarking means, with  
10 respect to digital content, embedding within such content data  
11 conveying attribution of the generation of such content to generative  
12 artificial intelligence.
- 13 **SECTION 4.** The Department of Commerce will oversee the enforcement of this  
14 legislation.
- 15 A. The National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST), in  
16 cooperation with the Department of Commerce, will introduce and  
17 implement standards for regulating watermarks on generative artificial  
18 intelligence.
- 19 B. Allocation of Funds: \$55 million shall be earmarked to support the  
20 efforts of the Department of Commerce to ensure compliance.
- 21 C. Those in violation of this legislation shall pay a fine of \$100 to the  
22 Department of Commerce.
- 23 **SECTION 5.** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027. All laws in conflict with  
24 this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Bill to Repeal the Communist Control Act of 1954

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** *The Communist Control Act of 1954* (68 Stat. 775, 50 U.S.C. §§ 841–844) is  
2 hereby repealed in its entirety.

3 **SECTION 2.** a. Any individual previously convicted under the provisions of the said Act  
4 shall be fully exonerated.

5 b. All sentences imposed under said Act shall be terminated immediately,  
6 and all related criminal records shall be expunged.

7 c. Any ongoing investigation, prosecution, or trial concerning alleged  
8 violations of said Act shall cease immediately.

9 d. Any fines collected under said Act shall be reimbursed in full to the  
10 individuals or entities from which they were collected.

11 e. Individuals previously rendered ineligible to hold public office due to  
12 convictions under said Act shall have their eligibility fully restored.

13 **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be overseen by the Department of Justice.

14 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect immediately upon passage. All laws in  
15 conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
