

A Bill to Enact a Clean Packaging Act

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** All companies selling packaged goods in the United States will be required
3 to use recyclable or biodegradable packaging by the year 2030.

4 **SECTION 2.** For the purpose of this legislation, recyclable or biodegradable packaging
5 will be defined as:

6 A. Materials that can be processed and reused in commercial recycling facilities;

7 B. Packaging that can decompose naturally without releasing harmful chemicals;

8 C. Products certified by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as meeting
9 national sustainability standards.

10 **SECTION 3.** The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) shall be responsible for the
11 implementation and enforcement of this Act.

12 A. The EPA will oversee the creation of guidelines for recyclable and
13 biodegradable materials by 2030.

14 B. Companies failing to meet these requirements after January 1, 2030,
15 shall be fined up to \$50,000 per violation.

16 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2027.

17 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Implement Artificial Intelligence to Manage Traffic

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The United States federal government shall allocate 10 billion dollars
3 annually to fund the research, development, and implementation of
4 Artificial Intelligence in traffic control systems across the country, in order
5 to reduce traffic congestion and losses associated with it.

6 **SECTION 2.** “Artificial Intelligence” is included but not limited to machine learning,
7 predictive analysis, and automated reasoning algorithms primarily
8 designed to assist in traffic control without major human input. “Traffic
9 control systems” are defined as systems designed to decrease and
10 manage traffic across transportation infrastructure, including but not
11 limited to air traffic, road traffic, and maritime traffic.

12 **SECTION 3.** The U.S Department of Transportation will oversee the implementation of
13 this legislation, and allocate funds while ensuring that the following
14 quotas are met:

15 A. At least 15% of the funding shall go towards improving current AI data
16 and systems in order to reduce bias.

17 B. At least 20% of the funding shall go towards private sector entities on
18 researching, developing, and implementing the aforementioned
19 technologies, both in direct government grants and public-private
20 collaborative efforts.

21 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on August 1, 2026.

22 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Mandate Federal Minimum Pay Standards for Teachers

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** A national minimum salary for all full-time public school teachers in the
3 United States. The base salary will be set at \$60,000 per year, adjusted
4 annually based on the regional Cost of Living Index (COLI).

5 A. States and school districts may exceed the federal minimum, but may
6 not set salaries lower than the mandated minimum.

7 B. This minimum salary shall apply to all newly hired and currently
8 employed teachers.

9 **SECTION 2.** Definitions:

10 A. Teacher shall be defined as any individual employed full-time by a
11 public elementary or secondary school who is certified/licensed to
12 provide classroom instruction.

13 B. COLI shall be defined as the Bureau of Labor Statistics metric that
14 measures regional differences in the cost of living.

15 **SECTION 3.** Funding and Enforcement

16 A. The Department of Education shall oversee the implementation and ongoing
17 compliance. The Department shall also determine a fair penalty for noncompliance.

18 a. States shall be required to submit annual compliance
19 reports verifying teacher salaries

20 b. States found to be noncompliant shall be given a one-year
21 corrective period before penalties are enforced.

22 B. Funding will come from a 0.5% tax on incomes over \$400,000.

23 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect at the start of the 2027-2028 school year.

24 The tax in Section 3 will go into effect on 1 January 2027. All laws in
25 conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Resolution to Address Violence and Instability in the Democratic Republic of Congo

1 **WHEREAS**, the Democratic Republic of Congo is failing in its duty to provide safety
2 and security for Congolese citizens; and

3 **WHEREAS**, the Congolese rebel group March 23 Movement (M23) is receiving military
4 support, including training and weapons, from the Rwandan Government; and

5 **WHEREAS**, M23 soldiers have killed, sexually assaulted, and targeted civilians
6 throughout the Kivu region; and

7 **WHEREAS**, China's dependence on DRC's cobalt reserves have complicated and
8 increased the violence; and

9 **WHEREAS**, current peacekeeping deals have not adequately addressed the violence
10 in DRC; and

11 **WHEREAS**, Infrastructure in DRC is crumbling due to the ongoing violence; now,
12 therefore, be it

13 **RESOLVED**, that the Congress here assembled condemns the M23's violence,
14 condemns Rwanda for their continued support of M23, and condemns
15 China for abusing the conflict for their own gain; and, be it

16 **FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the United States provide \$1 billion in humanitarian aid to the
17 Congolese people through the United Nations Organization Stabilization
18 Mission in the DRC (MONUSCO) and non-governmental organizations
19 operating in and around the country; and be it

20 **FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the United States provide \$1 billion in infrastructure
21 assistance through foreign direct investment.
