## A Bill to Improve Vaccination Access for Senior Citizens to Reduce Illness and Hospitalizations from Preventable Diseases

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	The Department of Health and Human Services shall receive a 25% increase
2		in annual federal funding specifically designated for expanding vaccine
3		resources in senior living communities.
4	SECTION 2.	Senior Citizens are defined as individuals aged 65 years and older living in
5		senior living communities. Vaccinations include all vaccines recommended
6		by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) for senior citizens,
7		such as influenza, pneumococcal, and shingles vaccines.
8	SECTION 3.	The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) shall oversee the
9		implementation and enforcement of this legislation.
10	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2026. All laws in conflict with
11		this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# A Bill to Legalize Secession from the Union to Fortify States' Rights

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	A state may secede from the Union upon the approval of a majority of its
2		eligible voters through a statewide referendum. Upon the certification of
3		such a vote, the federal government shall relinquish jurisdiction over the
4		seceding state. Federal funding to the state shall cease, and all removable
5		federal assets shall be returned to the Union.
6	SECTION 2.	"Removable federal assets" shall refer to national property or resources
7		that can reasonably be withdrawn or relocated. Examples include, but are
8		not limited to, federal military personnel and movable equipment.
9		Non-removable infrastructure, such as federally constructed dams or
10		immovable facilities, shall remain in place.
11	SECTION 3.	The Department of Defense, Department of State, Department of the
12		Treasury, Department of Homeland Security, and the General Services
13		Administration shall jointly administer and oversee the execution of this
14		legislation, ensuring an orderly and transparent transition of authority to
15		the seceding state.
16	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect immediately upon passage. All laws in
17		conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to Protect the Economic Rights of the American People During a Government Shutdown

1	RESOLVED,	By two-thirds	of the Congress here assembled, that the following article is
2		proposed as a	n amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which
3		shall be valid	to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
4		ratified by the	e legislatures of three-fourths of the several states within
5		seven years fr	om the date of its submission by the Congress:
6			ARTICLE
7		SECTION 1:	When the Government shuts down due to disagreements in
8			funding legislation:
9			A) Americans who meet the requirements for economic
10			assistance will keep their economic benefits for at least
11			three months.
12 13			B) Federal funding for public services like "free lunch in
13			public schools" will continue to have money pumped into
15			these services for at least three months.
16			C) Up to 10% of the current federal spending budget for
17			military and foreign aid, unless in direct use of a global issue
18			involving potential war with the United States or an ally of
19			the United States, will be redirected as fit to fund the
20			economic benefits
21		SECTION 2:	The Congress shall have power to enforce this article by

## A Bill to Make the Legal Military Joining Age 21

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	The legal age required to join the military will be increased to 21 years of
2		age.
3	SECTION 2.	The United States Military Entrance Processing Command (USMEPCOM) will
4		oversee this Bill to ensure no one under 21 years of age can join any or all
5		military branches.
6	SECTION 3.	This Bill will also increase the Draft age to 21.
7	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2026
	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Resolution to Recognize Free-Trade in the South China Sea

1	WHEREAS,	The South China Sea has a current ongoing dispute in territorial claims; and
2	WHEREAS,	China's actions towards South-Asian countries that wish to trade in the
3		South China Sea has been increased surveillance, physical terraforming of
4		the reefs into islands, and usage of military gear; and
5	WHEREAS,	The threatening of free-trade as well as the lack for America to reach out in
6		agreement of a "free-trade clause" is downright unconstitutional; now,
7		therefore, be it
8	RESOLVED,	That the Congress here assembled formally make a statement towards
9		firmly suggesting the inclusion of a free-trade agreement within the South
10		China Sea, and that any further disagreement may be met with U.S.
11		involvement.





### The Academic Centralization Act

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	States will now be required to use a nationwide dual-system education,
2		with an academic system similar to those in European countries with more
3		emphasis on a full pathway towards an individual's goals and aspirations.
4	SECTION 2.	Dual-system education separates middle and high school students based
5		on their own planned career, providing them with vocational training
6		alongside their general education.
7	SECTION 3.	The Department of Education (DOE) will oversee the implementation of
8		this legislation into schools nationwide, while the Internal Revenue Service
9		(IRS) will ensure that any states and/or school districts that do not wish to
10		implement this legislation into schools pay the fee.
11	SECTION 4.	School districts and/or states found to be in noncompliance with this
12		legislation will be met with fine of 5% of their annual education budget per
13		month until compliance.
14	SECTION 5.	Phasing in the acts of this legislation would take effect starting on January
15		1st, 2027, and solidify and take full effect by January 1st, 2029.
16	SECTION 6.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
