

# Item 1: A Bill to Establish a Federal Framework Protecting Consumer Data Privacy in the United States.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** The federal government shall enact a national data privacy law that grants  
2 consumers the right to access, correct, and delete personal data collected  
3 by private corporations.

4 A. Corporations collecting personal data shall be required to obtain  
5 clear, informed consent from users prior to data collection or sale.

6 B. Consumers may access, correct, and delete their data at any point  
7 after collection by the private company.

8 **SECTION 2.** "Personal data" shall be defined as any information that identifies, relates  
9 to, or could reasonably be linked to an individual consumer.

10 **SECTION 3.** Enforcement of this law shall be carried out by the Federal Trade  
11 Commission, which shall be granted expanded regulatory and punitive  
12 authority.

13 A. This legislation shall preempt state-level data privacy laws to ensure  
14 uniform national standards.

15 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect one year after passage. All laws in conflict  
16 with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.



## Item 2: A Resolution to Transition the United States to a Four-Day Work Week

- 1   **WHEREAS,**    The traditional five-day work week has remained largely unchanged  
2                    despite major advances in productivity; and
- 3   **WHEREAS,**    Long work hours contribute to burnout, decreased job satisfaction, and  
4                    declining mental health outcomes; and
- 5   **WHEREAS,**    Studies and pilot programs demonstrate that reduced work weeks can  
6                    maintain or improve productivity; and
- 7   **WHEREAS,**    Improving work-life balance strengthens families and communities; now,  
8                    therefore, be it
- 9   **RESOLVED,**   That the Congress here assembled supports redefining full-time  
10                   employment as a four-day, 32-hour work week without reduction in pay.

## Item 3: A Bill to Prohibit Congressional Stock Trading

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1   **SECTION 1.**   Members of the United States Congress and their immediate family  
2                   members shall be prohibited from owning or trading individual stocks while  
3                   in office.
- 4                   A.   All individual stocks must be placed into a blind trust or sold before  
5                   being sworn in as an official congress member.
- 6   **SECTION 2.**   “Immediate family members” shall include spouses and dependent  
7                   children.
- 8   **SECTION 3.**   The Office of Congressional Ethics shall oversee enforcement, with  
9                   violations resulting in fines and referral to appropriate ethics committees.
- 10                  A.   Member-elects will be denied their ability to swear-in until proof of  
11                  compliance is given.
- 12 **SECTION 4.**   This legislation will take effect on January 3, 2027. All laws in conflict with  
13                  this legislation are hereby declared null and void.



# Item 4: A Bill to Implement a National Carbon Fee and Dividend Program

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1    **SECTION 1.**    A carbon fee of \$50 per metric ton of carbon dioxide equivalent (CO<sub>2</sub>e)  
2                   shall be imposed on fossil fuels extracted or imported into the United  
3                   States. This fee shall increase annually by 5 percent above inflation.  
4                   A. All revenue generated by the carbon fee shall be returned to United  
5                   States citizens in the form of equal quarterly dividend payments,  
6                   distributed on a per-capita basis.
- 7    **SECTION 2.**    For clarification, the following terms are defined:  
8                   A. “Fossil fuels” shall include coal, petroleum, natural gas, and any  
9                   derivative products that emit carbon dioxide when combusted.  
10                  B. “Carbon dioxide equivalent (CO<sub>2</sub>e)” shall refer to the standardized  
11                  measurement used to compare the emissions of various  
12                  greenhouse gases based on their global warming potential.
- 13 **SECTION 3.**    The Environmental Protection Agency shall oversee emissions reporting  
14                   and fee collection in coordination with the Department of the Treasury.  
15                  A. Producers or importers who fail to comply shall be subject to civil  
16                  penalties of up to \$25,000 per day of noncompliance, in addition to  
17                  payment of owed fees.
- 18 **SECTION 4.**    This legislation will take effect on FY 2027. All laws in conflict with this  
19                   legislation are hereby declared null and void.
