

Prohibit the Teaching of Religious Texts

A Bill to Prohibit the Teaching of Religious Texts in Public Schools

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** It shall be hereby prohibited for teachers to present the contents of
2 religious text as fact in classroom curriculums in public schools.
- 3 **SECTION 2.** Religious texts shall be defined as a sacred document that is central to the
4 beliefs and practices of a particular religion such as the Bible, the Torah, the
5 Qur'an, and more.
- 6 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Education in collaboration with the Department of
7 Justice shall oversee the implementation of this legislation.
- 8 A. Teachers found in violation of this legislation shall either have their
9 teaching license revoked or lose their teaching position at their current
10 school of employment depending on the severity of the violation.
- 11 B. If a school is found in violation of this legislation they will have their
12 federal funding docked.
- 13 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on February 1, 2025. All laws in conflict with
14 this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Bill for Online Pubic School

A Bill to Expand Access to Digital Education

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** The federal government will hereby redefine public schools to encompass
2 online schools, therefore standardizing and levelling funding and education
3 standards.
- 4 **SECTION 2.** Public schools shall be required to incorporate or create an online public
5 school with a standard per pupil funding and educational standard that
6 matches their brick and mortar expectations.
- 7 **SECTION 3.** Public schooling and, by extension, public schools will now include online
8 education, such that each school will provide an online schooling option,
9 with proportional funding per student for every fully online learner.
10 Preportunal funding is only required for fully online students All schools
11 must endorse all students' opt for online schooling.
- 12 A. The Department of Education (DOE) shall oversee the
13 implementation and appropriation of funding for this program,
14 alongside punishment for lack of compliance.
- 15 B. If a public school requires funding for the implementation, it shall
16 be allocated via the DOE on a by-need basis, though schools will be
17 encouraged to incorporate existing online school options
- SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect in FY 2027. All laws in conflict with this
 legislation are hereby declared null and void.

National budget voting

A Bill to Establish a National Budget Vote

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** The federal government will hereby establish a national vote on the
2 funding of the federal government's functional category spending.

3 **SECTION 2.** Voters will be able to assign a percentage of the total annual funding
4 established by Congress in the FY. On each ballot, the percentage vote will
5 establish voting for all 20 functional categories that Congress has
6 identified.

7 **SECTION 3.** Voting will occur exactly one week after Congress votes on the spending
8 resolution for the FY. votes will be averaged out, and the average shall be
9 the appropriation of funds to an identified sector. Congress will then decide
10 which programs the funding will go to, limited by the amount voted on by
11 the nation.

12 A. Each state will be required to administer this vote and provide
13 appropriate infrastructure for both in-person and mail-in voting.

14 B. The Office of Management and Budget will be responsible for the
15 oversight and adherence to funds appropriated by the nation.

16 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on October 1st, 2026. All laws in conflict
 with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
