

# A Bill to Ban the Export of Electronic Waste to Developing Nations to Promote Ethical Recycling Practices

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THIS UIL CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The export of electronic waste (e-waste) from the United States to  
3 developing nations shall be prohibited.

4 **SECTION 2.** Electronic waste (e-waste) is defined as discarded electrical or electronic  
5 devices and their components, including but not limited to computers,  
6 smartphones, tablets, televisions, batteries, and associated parts. Developing  
7 nations shall be defined according to the most recent classification of the  
8 United Nations Human Development Index (HDI).

9 **SECTION 3.** The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the U.S. Customs and  
10 Border Protection (CBP) shall oversee enforcement of this legislation.

11 A. Any corporation, exporter, or individual found in violation shall be fined  
12 up to \$250,000 per container of exported e-waste.

13 B. Repeat violators may face suspension of import/export licenses for up to  
14 five years.

15 **SECTION 4.** Funding for enforcement shall come from existing EPA and CBP budget  
16 allocations, with additional fines collected under this act reinvested into  
17 domestic recycling programs.

18 **SECTION 5.** This legislation shall take effect on January 31, 2026. All laws in conflict  
19 with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Bill to Implement a Four-Day School Week

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THIS UIL CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** All public K-12 schools in the United States shall transition to a four-  
3 day school week. Total instructional time shall remain at least equal to  
4 current annual requirements mandated by state education laws.

5 **SECTION 2.** In the context of this legislation, a "four-day school week" shall mean  
6 four instructional days per week, with each day consisting of no fewer  
7 than 7.5 hours of instruction.

8 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Education shall oversee implementation of this  
9 legislation by:

10 A. Providing guidance and grants to assist districts with  
11 restructuring their schedules.

12 B. Ensuring compliance with all current state and federal  
13 instructional standards.

14 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect on August 1st, 2027.

15 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and  
void.

## A Bill to Implement Mandatory Gun Safety Education in School

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1    **SECTION 1.**    This bill would establish a federal K-12 Gun Safety Education curriculum  
2                    in the United States, in which all states will have the choice whether or  
3                    not to implement this program. The curriculum of the Gun Safety  
4                    Education program will be that of the Civilian Marksmanship Program's  
5                    youth gun safety education course.

6    **SECTION 2.**    Gun Safety Education is defined as structured K-12 educational initiatives,  
7                    training courses, and outreach efforts designed to teach the responsible  
8                    handling, secure storage, and proper operation of firearms. The Civilian  
9                    Marksmanship Program is defined as a federally chartered 501(c)(3)  
10                   non-profit corporation established by Congress in 1996 to promote  
11                   firearm safety and training, particularly for youth.

12 **SECTION 3.**    The United States Department of Homeland Security and Department of  
13                    Education will work to oversee the implementation of this bill.

14                    A. Failure to oversee the implementation of this bill by states will  
15                    result in no education funding from the federal government until  
16                    said bill is implemented.

17                    B. The Department of Education and the Department of Homeland  
18                    Security will provide grants to support state implementation of the  
                      Gun Safety Education program.

**SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect January 1, 2027. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Bill to Implement Artificial Intelligence to Manage Traffic

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2           **SECTION 1.**    The United States federal government shall allocate 10  
3 billion dollars annually to fund the research, development, and  
4 implementation of Artificial Intelligence in traffic control systems across  
5 the country, in order to reduce traffic congestion and losses associated  
6 with it.

7           **SECTION 2.**    “Artificial Intelligence” is included but not limited to  
8 machine learning, predictive analysis, and automated reasoning  
9 algorithms primarily designed to assist in traffic control without major  
10 human input. “Traffic control systems” are defined as systems designed  
11 to decrease and manage traffic across transportation infrastructure,  
12 including but not limited to air traffic, road traffic, and maritime traffic.

13           **SECTION 3.**    The U.S Department of Transportation will oversee the  
14 implementation of this legislation, and allocate funds while ensuring that  
15 the following quotas are met:

- 16           A. At least 15% of the funding shall go towards improving current AI data  
17 and systems in order to reduce bias.
- 18           B. At least 20% of the funding shall go towards private sector entities on  
19 researching, developing, and implementing the aforementioned  
technologies, both in direct government grants and public-private  
collaborative efforts.

20           **SECTION 4.**    This legislation will take effect on August 1, 2026.

21           **SECTION 5.**    All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared  
22 null and void.

## A Bill to Impose a Border Carbon Adjustment on Imported Goods

BE IT ENACTED BY THIS UIL CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1     **SECTION 1.**    The United States will impose a tariff on imported goods based upon  
2                            their carbon intensity relative to domestic manufacturing standards.

3     **SECTION 2.**    The Border Carbon Adjustment (BCA) will levy a tariff on foreign  
4                            imports based in whole on the amount of carbon dioxide emitted to  
5                            produce and/or transport them. Products exceeding U.S. average  
6                            emissions per unit will incur an import fee proportional to excess  
7                            emissions.

8     **SECTION 3.**    The U.S. International Trade Commission (USITC) will oversee  
9                            enforcement of this bill.

10                        A. The Department of Energy's Office of Fossil Energy and Carbon  
11                            Management (FECM) shall gather data, verify compliance through  
12                            annual importer reporting, and levy tariffs on the carbon intensity  
13                            of foreign goods.

14                        B. The U.S. Treasury Department will collect revenue garnered from  
15                            the Border Carbon Adjustment.

16                        C. All revenue shall be allocated to clean energy research and  
17                            domestic manufacturing incentives.

18     **SECTION 4.**    This legislation takes effect on January 1, 2027.

19     **SECTION 5.**    All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and  
20                            void.
