



A Constitutional Amendment to Clarify the Right to Bear Arms

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **RESOLVED,** By two-thirds of the Congress here assembled, that the following article is
2 proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which
3 shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
4 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states within
5 seven years from the date of its submission by the Congress:

6 **ARTICLE --**

7 **SECTION 1:** A National Guard, and in the absence thereof, the ability of
8 the People to form an organized Militia to defend life, liberty, and property
9 from all threats, foreign and domestic, being necessary to the Security of
10 the People and the Government of the United States of America, the right
11 of the People to keep and bear certain arms, under appropriate Scrutiny as
12 is necessary to ensure the safety of the general public, for the purpose of
13 responsibly discharging these Duties, and with respect for recreation and
14 necessity, shall not be infringed without due process under law.

15 **SECTION 2:** The Congress shall have the power to enforce this article
16 through the appropriate legislation.

17 **SECTION 3:** This article shall supersede the Second Amendment to the
18 Constitution of the United States upon ratification.



A Bill to Abolish Mandatory Minimums for Non Violent Drug Crimes

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** All federal mandatory minimum sentencing requirements for non violent
2 drug offenses, as established under 21 U.S.C. Section 841 and 21 U.S.C.
3 Section 844, are hereby abolished. Judges shall have full discretion to
4 depart from previously mandated minimums based on the specific
5 circumstances of the case and the defendant.

6 **SECTION 2.** Non violent drug crimes are defined as offenses involving the possession,
7 manufacture, or distribution of controlled substances that do not involve
8 the use of a firearm, the threat or use of physical force, or an injury.

9 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Justice shall oversee the implantation of this bill.

10 A. Any cost savings realized from reduced incarceration rates shall be
11 reallocated to the Bureau of Justice Assistance for drug treatment and
12 rehabilitation programs.

13 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on January 1st 2027. All laws in conflict with
14 this legislation are hereby declared null and void.



A Bill to Require Law Enforcement Officers to Utilize Recording Gear

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** All law enforcement officers are required to utilize active recording gear as
2 soon as they engage with any individual through public interaction with the
3 active intent to procure arrests or detainment, when in the course of their
4 duty.
- 5 **SECTION 2.** Definitions:
- 6 A. *Law enforcement:* all federal, state, and local law enforcement
7 officers, including but not limited to police, sheriffs, state troopers,
8 FBI agents, ICE agents, etc.
- 9 B. *Active recording gear:* body-worn cameras, dash cams, etc., that
10 will be visually and audibly active from the beginning of any
11 investigation/interaction to the end of any investigation/
12 interaction. At no point should this gear be obstructed or removed,
13 except in limited instances in order to protect privacy (i.e., in a
14 private home).
- 15 C. *Public interaction:* traffic stops, suspect arrests, warranted
16 searches, etc.
- 17 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Justice (DOJ) and the Department of Homeland Security
18 (DHS) will oversee the implementation of the gear into vehicles and onto
19 worn gear. The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) will oversee the increase in
20 the amount of taxes, and how well the increase in taxes pays for the cost of
21 the items listed in this legislation.
- 22 A. States that cannot pay for video and audio equipment will be
23 compensated with taxpayer dollars, with an increase in taxes up to
24 1% over the span of 1 year. After 1 year, taxes will be reduced back
25 to their original levels, and any residual currency will be used for
26 repairs and reimplementation.
- 27 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will be phased in starting on July 1st, 2026, and will be fully
28 implemented no later than January 1st, 2027. All laws in conflict with this
29 legislation are hereby declared null and void.



A Bill to Support Cuban Self-Determination and Prevent Military Escalation

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** The United States shall provide limited energy assistance to the Republic of
2 Cuba to prevent a humanitarian and infrastructural crisis resulting from the
3 cessation of Venezuelan oil shipments, while prohibiting any U.S. military
4 interventions or hostile action toward Cuba.

5 **SECTION 2.** There are three key provisions:

6 A. The Department of Energy (DOE) is hereby authorized to export up to
7 50,000 barrels per day of crude oil or refined petroleum to Cuba for civilian
8 electricity generation for a period not exceeding one year.

9 B. The Department of Defense (DoD) and Executive Branch shall be
10 prohibited from initiating, directing, or funding any military action,
11 airstrike, or covert operation against Cuba without explicit congressional
12 authorization in accordance with the War Powers Resolution of 1973.

13 C. No funds appropriated to the Department of Defense or any related
14 agency may be used to plan or conduct offensive operations against Cuba.

15 **SECTION 3.** There are three key provisions:

16 A. The Department of Energy shall coordinate with the U.S. Agency for
17 International Development (USAID) to ensure that all exports are used
18 exclusively for energy production and civilian purposes.

19 B. The Government Accountability Office (GAO) shall oversee compliance
20 and report quarterly to Congress on shipments, expenditures, and energy
21 outcomes in Cuba.

22 C. Any violation of this Act's prohibitions shall constitute an unlawful act
23 under 50 U.S.C. 1547 (War Powers Resolution) and trigger immediate
24 congressional review.

25 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on April 1, 2026, and remain in force for a
26 period of two years unless reauthorized by Congress. All laws in conflict
27 with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.



A Bill to Promote Affordable Postsecondary Education

1. **BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**

2. **SECTION 1.** All U.S. citizens shall be entitled to equal and affordable postsecondary
3. education, thereby protecting students from exorbitant student loan
4. debts, fostering a more proficient workforce, and promoting economic
5. mobility, prosperity, and competitiveness in the global economy. Thus, no
6. eligible institution shall charge an annual in-state or out-of-state tuition
7. exceeding \$7,500. Eligible institutions shall also be incentivized to expand
8. scholarship programs. Additionally, the Free Postsecondary Education
9. Program shall allow eligible individuals to be enrolled in eligible
10. institutions for a time period of no more than four years, and all tuition
11. costs due within this period shall be waived.

12. **SECTION 2.** The following definitions apply:

13. A. Postsecondary education shall be defined as any education beyond high school,
14. including but not limited to community colleges, vocational schools, technical
15. schools, and four-year colleges and universities.

16. B. An eligible institution shall be defined as any public institution recognized by the
17. Department of Education that offers postsecondary education.

18. **SECTION 3.** To be eligible for the Free Postsecondary Education Program, an
19. individual must be a documented U.S. citizen or a legal permanent
20. resident currently living below their state poverty line. Eligibility shall be
21. determined based on a sliding scale that counts for the individual or
22. family's income, ensuring that those with the greatest financial need
23. receive the most aid.

24. **SECTION 4.** The Department of Education, relevant federal agencies, and state
25. governments shall coordinate to oversee the implementation of the Free
26. Postsecondary Education Program. All necessary funding to cover costs as
27. a result of this legislation will be allocated by the general fund of the
28. Treasury to the necessary entities with a budget of \$15 billion annually.
29. No new taxes shall be levied for the purpose of this legislation.

30. **SECTION 5.** This legislation will take effect at the end of the current academic year. All
31. eligible institutions are expected to be in compliance with this legislation
32. by October 1, 2026. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby
33. declared null and void.
