

A Bill to Ban Homeschooling to Enhance Social Activity and Independence

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** In order to ensure children have the opportunity to gain independence and
3 receive the basic standards of education and fundamental skills,
4 homeschooling shall be banned for children of appropriate age for education.

5 **SECTION 2.** The terms shall be defined as followed:

6 A. "Basic Standards of Education" shall be defined as the basic skills
7 necessary to learn the average school curriculum.

8 B. "Homeschooling" shall be defined as education conducted in any
9 place other than a school.

10 C. "Appropriate Age for Education" shall be defined as any person at or
11 between the ages of 4 to 17.

12 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Education shall pull the funding of institutions,
13 individuals, and programs that receive Federal funds if they do not comply
14 with the provisions of this bill.

15 A. Recipients of Federal funds through grants, agreements, loans, or
16 arrangements are subject to the consequences of encouraging
17 homeschooling.

18 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2025. All laws in conflict with
19 this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Balance the Budget

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1 **SECTION 1.** The IRS will be given 100 billion specifically to audit and
2 prosecute high income Americans, and will be given the authority to do so
3 on a retroactive basis

4 **SECTION 2.** A tax of 2% of all wealth above 50 million dollars shall be
5 implemented

6 **SECTION 3.** A Carbon tax of 25 dollars per ton emitted shall be
7 implemented

8 **SECTION 4.** The tax on incomes over 640,600 shall be raised from 37%
9 to 50%

10 **SECTION 5.** A.The department of defense shall be required to submit successful,
11 comprehensive audit

12 B. If the department cannot submit a successful, comprehensive audit, the
13 budget shall be set at 750 billion

14 **SECTION 6.** Capital gains taxes shall increase by 25% across all tax brackets

15 **SECTION 7.** Corporate tax rates shall be raised from 21% to 35%

16 **SECTION 8.** the agencies that will oversee this bill shall be the IRS,
17 Department of defense

18 A. all taxes will be overseen by the IRS

19 B. the military audits will be overseen by the department of defense

20 **SECTION 9.** This legislation will take effect on Oct 1 2028. All laws in
21 conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Aid Mozambique

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The United States shall provide \$450 million in humanitarian aid to
3 Mozambique to address the crises resulting from conflict, natural
4 disasters, and economic challenges.

5 **SECTION 2.** “Humanitarian Aid” shall be defined as financial assistance provided for
6 food, shelter, healthcare, and infrastructure reconstruction.

7 **SECTION 3.** The United States Agency for International Development (USAID) shall
8 oversee the distribution and management of the humanitarian aid.

9 A. USAID shall work in collaboration with the Mozambican government
10 and international humanitarian organizations to ensure the effective
11 and transparent use of funds.

12 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall be implemented immediately upon passage. All laws
13 in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Restrict the Use of Artificial Intelligence Technologies in Healthcare

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. Artificial Intelligence and Large Language Models are hereby banned from use in healthcare settings unless a human operator retains decision-making control at every step of the process. Under no circumstances should the aforementioned technologies be implemented without proper controls.

SECTION 2. "Artificial Intelligence" is defined as any technology which makes autonomous decisions without human input. "Large Language Models" are defined as any chatbot technology that can process natural language and autonomously generate a response.

SECTION 3. Enforcement of this bill will be delegated to the Department of Health and Human Services. Healthcare entities found to be in violation of this bill will be fined no less than \$10,000 per violation.

SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect immediately after passing. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Introduced for Congressional Debate by Belen Jesuit Preparatory School

A Bill to Implement a National Prescription Drug Price Negotiation Program

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. The United States shall establish a National Prescription Drug Price Negotiation Program (NPDN Program) to negotiate and set maximum prices for the top 50 most prescribed medications in the country.

SECTION 2. Definitions:

A. "Top 50 most prescribed medications" refers to a list of drugs most commonly prescribed, as determined by the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS).

B. "Negotiated Price" refers to the maximum price set for a prescription medication under the NPDN program after negotiations between the government and pharmaceutical companies.

SECTION 3. The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) shall oversee the NPDN Program.

A. HHS shall annually negotiate prices with pharmaceutical companies to establish a maximum price scale for each drug in the top 50 list.

B. HHS shall penalize non-compliant pharmaceutical companies with a fine equal to 10% of the previous year's total sales of the noncompliant drug in the United States.

SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2026.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
