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#### A Bill to Protect our Kids

1	BE IT ENACTED	BY THE	CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1.	School	buses classified for use in public education must be outfitted
3		with th	ree-point seat belts at all designated seating positions.
5	SECTION 2.	Public	education refers to government-funded schools which provide
6		educat	ion free of charge to pupils. Three-point seat belts are belts that
7		goes o	ver the waist (lap) and the shoulder (sash) of the occupant.
8	SECTION 3.	The De	partment of Education shall work alongside the National
9		Highwa	ay Traffic Safety Administration to implement this legislation.
10		A.	The U.S. Department of Treasury shall make \$20 billion in
11			federal categorical grants available for local school districts from
12			the United States general fund.
13		B.	Districts that do not adopt these standards upon passage
14			shall lose access to federal transportation and highway grants
15			until compliant.
16	SECTION 4.	This la	w shall apply to all buses produced after January 1st, 2019.
17	SECTION 5.	All law	s in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.



# A Bill to Equalize the Paying Field

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:			
2	SECTION 1.	In order to combat the substantial gender pay gap that occurs		
3		post-p	regnancy for female employees, one year of paid leave is required	
4		by employers to be allocated towards the parents of a newborn working in		
5		the private and public sector.		
6		A.	Time must be equally split among parents, one parent may not	
7			absorb any time that the other does not utilize.	
8		В.	Female employees shall be legally protected from pregnancy	
9			discrimination 6 months before the due date and 1 year after birth.	
10	SECTION 2.	The ge	ender pay gap shall be defined as the average difference	
11		betwee	en the remuneration for men and women who are working. Paid	
12		leave s	shall be defined as time allowed away from work during which	
13		norma	I pay is received. Public sector shall be defined as	
14		govern	ment-owned organizations and government-provided services.	
15		Private	e sector shall be defined as companies owned by individuals.	
16	SECTION 3.	The De	epartment of Health and Human Services shall work alongside the	
17		Depart	ment of Justice to oversee the implementation of this bill.	
18	SECTION 4.	This la	w shall go into effect on June 7th, 2019.	
19	SECTION 5.	All law	s in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.	



## A Bill to Launch the Future of Travel

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:		
2	SECTION 1.	In ord	er to allow for supersonic innovation, Title 14, Part 36 of
3		the Co	ode of Federal Regulations, setting noise restrictions on supersonic
4		jets, i	s hereby amended by striking Subpart D.
5		A.	Supersonic flights over the continental US are no longer prohibited.
6	SECTION 2.	Super	sonic jets shall be defined as vehicles that are capable of fly faster
7		than t	he speed of sound.
8	SECTION 3.	The D	epartment of Transportation shall use the Federal Aviation
9		Admi	nistration (FAA) to closely monitor the effects .
10		A.	The FAA shall be given 10 billion dollars annually in federal grants
11			to put towards supersonic innovation that will expire in 10 years.
12		В.	The FAA shall conduct a yearly cost-benefit analysis using the
13			revenue generated from supersonic flights in US airspace to
14			establish viability and to determine if grants shall extend beyond
15			the 10 year limit.
16	SECTION 4.	This l	egislation will go into effect upon passage.
17	SECTION 5.	All lav	vs in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.



# A Bill to Legalize Recreational Use of Marijuana

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:		
2	SECTION 1.	Mariju	ana may be purchased by voting-aged citizens for recreational
3		use fro	om federally-regulated dispensaries.
4	SECTION 2.	A fede	rally-regulated dispensary is a commercial marijuana dispensary
5		that ha	as obtained a federal license from the Department of Health and
6		Huma	n Services and receives product from producers regulated by the
7		Depar	tment of Agriculture.
8	SECTION 3.	The De	epartment of Health and Human Services shall oversee
9		impler	nentation of this legislation by working alongside the Department
10		of Agr	iculture to establish a federal marijuana regulatory program within
11		the Fo	od and Drug Administration.
12		A.	A 15% excise tax shall be placed on all recreational marijuana
13			sales. The revenue from this excise tax will be used to fund the
14			construction of new public schools.
15		В.	A 10% sales tax shall be placed on all recreational marijuana
16			sales. Any revenues that result from this sales tax are to
17			be used to fund the federal bureaucracy that regulates and
18			monitors the marijuana retail business.
19	SECTION 4.	This la	aw shall go into effect on April 20th, 2020.
20	SECTION 5.	All law	vs in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.



# A Bill to Remove Sports from the Classroom

1	BE IT ENACTED	BY THE	CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1.	All ath	letic programs currently funded or managed by educational
3		institut	tions shall be suspended and permanently removed.
4	SECTION 2.	Athleti	c programs shall be defined as competitive programs and teams
5		requiri	ng physical skill and training in order to prepare athletes for
6		compe	tition performance. Educational institutions shall be defined as
7		public	primary and secondary schools within the U.S.
8	SECTION 3.	The De	epartment of Education shall oversee implementation of this bill.
9		В.	70% of the funding from current athletic programs shall go
10			towards improving school quality and providing new academic
11			resources to students.
12		В.	30% of the funding from current programs shall go towards
13			academic competitive programs and teams.
14	SECTION 4.	All pub	licly funded schools must comply with this legislation by
15		the gra	aduating of the Class of 2022.
16	SECTION 5.	All law	s in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.



#### A Bill to Power America into the 21st Century

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT: 1 2 SECTION 1. Pursuant to the powers vested to this Congress by the Fifth Amendment 3 of the Constitution, all privately held power infrastructure shall be 4 nationalized by the federal government to create a stable national grid. 5 SECTION 2. Power infrastructure shall be defined as, but not limited to, any and all 6 substations, power lines, utility poles, power plants, transformers and 7 distribution centers. Nationalized shall be defined as investing control or 8 ownership of power infrastructure in the national government. 9 SECTION 3. The Department of Energy shall oversee the implementation and 10 management of this bill. 11 Α. Funding for this bill shall come from a \$0.30 per gallon tax on 12 gasoline within the continental United States. 13 Β. All profit generated from electricity production shall go towards the creation of new renewable energy sources as to phase out all 14 15 carbon-emitting production of power. 16 SECTION 4. The national power grid shall be online by June 7th, 2030. 17 SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.



## A Bill to Prevent the Destruction of the Amazon Rainforest

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- SECTION 1. Economic sanctions shall hereby be imposed on Brazil. The United
   States shall encourage the multilateral cooperation of other countries
   to participate as well.
- 5 SECTION 2. Economic sanctions shall be defined as the cessation of importation of
   6 consumer products from Brazil, exportation of consumer
- 7 products, industrial equipment, technology, and resources to Brazil, and
- 8 the transfer of any military aid and assistance to Brazil.
- 9 SECTION 3. The State Department (SD) shall be in charge of observing and
  10 enforcing these sanctions. The SD may lift the sanctions if both the
  11 following conditions are met:
- A. The president of Brazil submits to the SD a policy outline of
  preserving the Amazon Rainforest and indigenous tribes.
- B. The State Department observes the effective implementation of
  this plan by Brazil without future reversal of such policy.
- 16 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will go into effect upon passage.
- 17 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.



## A Bill to Exercise the War Power Resolution to Prevent a Crisis in Yemen

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2 **SECTION 1**. Pursuant to Section 1544(c) of the War Powers Resolution of 1973, the
- 3 President of the United States shall remove all United States Armed
- Forces from hostilities in the Republic of Yemen not later than 60 days
  after the date of the adoption of this bill.
- 6 **SECTION 2**. Hostilities shall be defined as behavior harmful to U.S. Armed Forces.
- SECTION 3. The Department of Defense shall oversee the implementation of this bill
   in conjunction with the House Committee on Oversight and Government
   Reform.
- 10 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will go into effect upon passage.
- 11 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.



# A Resolution to Prevent the Overshoot of 1.5 Degrees Celsius Warming

1	WHEREAS,	Climate change has been categorically proven to being accelerated by
2		humans; and,
3	WHEREAS,	the 2018 U.N. IPCC report finds rapid unprecedented changes are
4		required in global energy, land, urban and infrastructure systems, and
5		industrial systems; and,
6	WHEREAS,	the report further finds carbon emissions would need to be cut by nearly
7		50 percent by 2030 to prevent overshoot of 1.5 degrees celsius
8		warming; and,
9	WHEREAS,	overshoot of 1.5 degrees celsius would result in catastrophic and
10		potentially irreversible consequences that would disrupt and threaten
11		the very existence of humanity; now, therefore, be it
12	RESOLVED,	That the Congress here assembled shall direct the United States
13		ambassador to the United Nations to submit a resolution to the U.N.
14		General Assembly that outlines a template plan of implementation for
15		every nation to prevent overshoot of 1.5 degrees celsius warming; and,
16		be it
17	FURTHER RE	SOLVED, all nations not in compliance with the goals wherein this
18		resolution and the proposed U.N. resolution shall be treated as
19		enemies of mankind and shall be reprimanded as such insofar
20		as United States foreign policy.
